Our work relies on strong, consistent partnership. We build relationships with students and families, school and community partners, supporters, and each other to create positive, lasting impact for tens of thousands of Chicago public-school students.

Because of CIS, students are more likely to come to school, stay in school, and graduate. Because of CIS, students have the resources and opportunities they need to achieve.

This school year, our team is present in 250 Chicago public schools, nearly 40 percent of the entire school district.

CIS of Chicago has supported the city's students since 1988 – for nearly four decades.

More than ever, the work we do matters.

Today's students experience many challenges that affect their ability to come to school and stay in school.

Since the pandemic, chronic absenteeism has risen to nearly 40 percent. This means that two out of five students missed at least 18 days of school during the 2024-25 school year.

More than 70 percent of Chicago public-school students are economically disadvantaged. In addition, the state of youth mental health continues to remain concerning with more than 40 percent of Chicago high school students experiencing symptoms of depression.

CIS of Chicago responds to these challenges by providing an integrated, yet tailored, approach. We partner with schools, teachers, community organizations, families, and the students themselves to propel young people on the path to graduation.

Partnership Program

The Partnership Program is our whole-school approach. It connects students at each of our 250 school partners with essential programs and resources provided by our vast network of community partners. Supports are equitable and inclusive, addressing the specific needs of schools and families.

The organizations in our network of community partners provide tailored support to students in six key areas:

- Academic support
- Arts and culture
- College and career readiness
- Counseling and supportive guidance
- Health and wellness
- Parent and family engagement

In June 2025, principals and other school leaders were asked about the impact of CIS of Chicago's partnership.

100% of respondents said that CIS of Chicago allows them to:

- **Access more needed services**
- **Connect with high-quality programs and opportunities**
- **And better identify and address student needs**



Intensive Program

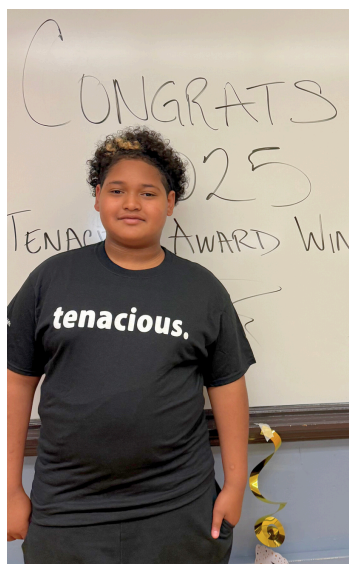
The Intensive Program is our individual-student approach. It embeds a CIS of Chicago team member in 40 of our 250 partner schools to provide direct, individualized support to students who need it most.

CIS school-based team members meet with students, one-on-one and in groups. They help students set goals around their attendance, behavior, grades, or social and emotional skills, and they give students the tools they need to make progress on their goals.

Since the 2018-19 school year, CIS of Chicago has provided more than 9,000 students with ongoing intensive support.

Case-managed students achieved the following outcomes:

- <1% of students dropped out
- 95% of seniors graduated
- 98% percent of PreK-11th graders were promoted to the next grade

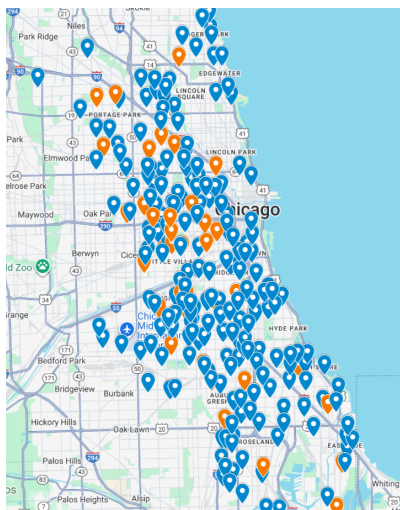

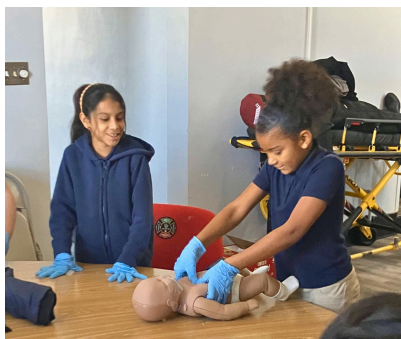

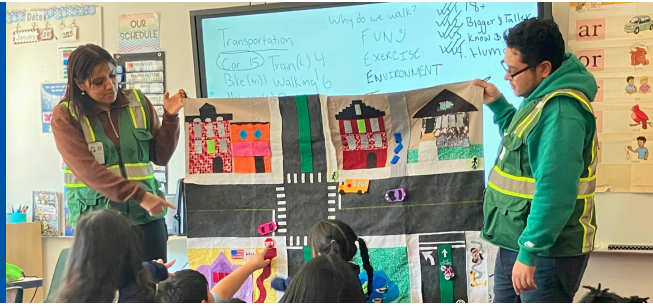

Our team also continued providing **Youth Mental Health First Aid** in the 2024-25 school year. The course equipped 185 teachers, partners, and other caring adults with the tools to recognize and respond to young people experiencing mental health distress.

Our Impact on Students and Partners

CIS of Chicago's two-program model allows the team to tailor our work, school by school, student by student.

At Rowe Elementary School on the Northwest Side, our CIS Student Supports Manager Jacob built relationships with school leaders, teachers, and parents to hear how he could best support students.

One priority for Rowe was safety education and emergency preparedness. The school had just moved K-3 students to a new building located on a street with heavy traffic. In response, Jacob connected all second-grade classes with the Chicago Department of Transportation (CDOT), one of CIS' community partners

Through CIS' relationship with CDOT, Jacob was able to ensure that Rowe received the full benefit of their programs and services. CDOT's SAFE Ambassadors came to Rowe for a classroom lesson on walking safety, and they came back to the school for an outdoor experiential walking tour so the students could apply their knowledge.

Jacob then reinforced the experience through his individual support at Rowe. He met with students on his caseload and empowered them to continue working towards their own goals for developing lifelong skills and staying in school.
